

End of Book Activities – Choose 1!

Book Jacket [construction paper, crayons, markers, or paint] to design an original book jacket that shows your favorite part of the story. On the back of the jacket, write a summary (SWBST) of your favorite part. Include your opinion of the book and whether or not you would recommend it.

Diorama [shoe box, construction paper, colored pencils, glue, etc.] Turn a shoe box on its side. Use materials of your choosing to make a scene from the story inside the shoebox. Use the SWBST strategy to describe the scene; write the description/summary on an index card and attach it to the top or back of the shoebox.

Collage [scissors, old magazines, glue, construction paper, other pictures] Cut out words and pictures from a magazine that represent different scenes from the story. Glue the pictures to a poster. Write the title of the book at the top of your collage.

Picture Dictionary [paper, stapler, crayons or markers] Assemble the paper like a book; staple in the center on the fold. Choose 20 interesting words from the book. Write each word at the top of a separate page. Draw a picture to represent the meaning of each word. Include a brief explanation of why this word is important to the story.

Presentation: Create a Google Slideshow or PowerPoint presentation about your book that includes:

- title and author
- character descriptions of three to five characters
- setting description
- problem and solution
- five important events from the book
- what the character learned
- may also include information about the author
- presentation must include pictures (one per slide). You may also include transitions, animation, and/or sound.
